PASTOR ERIK THONE Associate Pastor

"For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matt. 6:21)

Yuck. I just spent the last two weeks preaching about money as the Lectionary (which assigns our readings) designated the Parable of the Dishonest Manager (Luke 16:1-13) and the Rich Man and Lazarus (Luke 16:19-31) as our texts. As I noted, pastors don't like preaching about money any more than congregations like hearing about it (It's personal, sensitive, and uncomfortable for all). So why did Jesus talk about it so much (Because he really does talk about it a lot!)? I imagine it is, simply, because *we* think about it a lot. It affects our life multiple times on a daily basis and it's a significant factor in many of the larger

life-decisions we make. It's important to our lives so it's important to Jesus.

In general, Jesus' teachings on money fall into two categories: 1) Encouragement to use wealth to care for those in need, and 2) Warnings against wealth as an obstacle to spiritual well-being. I think the first is how Jesus addresses the concern of the second. Generous *attention* to others protects us from the self-centeredness that frequently comes between us and God.

As I reflected, I found myself increasingly convicted about this "attention" part. I'm an auto-pay guy. I set-up automatic giving and bill-pay every opportunity I get (including my church offering). It's convenient, it keeps me from late-fees, and it's good for the church. It also requires no attention on my part; I think there's a loss there. I'm not going to cancel my automatic giving, but I am going to try and pay closer attention because I think that the gift of giving comes to us through attention and reflection. The spiritual growth and health that Jesus offers in his teachings on money are dependent on prayerful consideration alongside the act of giving. Giving can change us, but only if we think about how and why we're giving.

So that's my invitation (or rather Jesus' invitation) to you. Budgeting often focuses on *how* we spend money, but I invite you to also consider *why* you spend money the way you do and ask yourself whether your budget reflects your values. One way or another, money, like time, transforms us through our constant use of it. It reinforces our values or it changes them. It draws us towards others or it turns us inward. It brings us closer to God or it becomes an obstacle between us and God. This can be a conscious choice, but, more often, I think it happens through unconscious habit. So pay attention and let your money bring you closer to God and your neighbors.



Council Minutes - August 16, 2022

Here are highlights from the August meeting:

- July Minutes: Approved
- Financials: Income for July was about \$37k. Expenditures were about \$67k, with a negative difference of about \$29K. In contrast, the difference in July 2021 was a negative 5k. Will be mindful of this deficit going forward, June - September are traditionally lower giving months.
- Council is planning a retreat this fall.
- Staff council is meeting with staff in September for reviews and to work on developing quality job descriptions.
- Outdoor Space task force is meeting in August to compile ideas, wants, needs and feasibility of the space.
- Council meeting time was moved to the second Monday of the month at 6pm.


