I WONDER ABOUT WONDER.

Dear Siblings in Christ,

There is a story that sticks out to me in the gospel of Luke, Chapter 5, where Jesus heals a paralyzed man. It's the one where the man's friends lower him down to Jesus through a hole in the roof because the crowds are so thick. As part of the religious leaders, as only God can forgive sins, and they begin to question who Jesus is that he does something reserved only for God. It is at this point that Jesus

asks them "why do you raise such questions in your hearts?" Then as proof of his authority he tells the man to "stand up and take his mat and go home." The man gets up and goes home glorifying God. Then the text says "Wonder (Amazement) seized all of them, and they glorified God and were filled with awe, saying, "We have seen strange things today."

As we move towards Lent, I find myself wondering about Wonder. We all have questions about God and life and suffering and blessing. We have questions about God's goodness and people's badness. Why did this (insert your experience here) happen to me? Why is this (insert) happening to me now? What is going to happen in the future? Why does God seem so close and present and faith seem so easy sometimes while other times it is just difficult to connect to God?

In the above text, even though people experienced Jesus standing before them they still had a difficult time understanding God's work; nevertheless they glorified God and celebrated the strange things they had seen that day. The strange things are what sticks out to me. God did unexpected works of blessing like healing the man and forgiving sins and so I wonder if I miss strange things that God is doing which might cause me to celebrate if I would but pay attention.

This Lent, as we prepare to Celebrate Jesus' love for us on the cross and his resurrection from the dead, our invitation is to embrace Wonder. Wondering invites us to live into unanswerable questions, to explore the strange works of God's love that we might miss because we are busy or just not looking for them or they are unexpected. During worship we will experience interesting bible characters that help us wonder about God's work and remind us that one thing is always certain: God loves us and will always be with us on our journey. In the upcoming days, may you be filled with wonder at the works of God.




THE CALL PROCESS UPDATE




Nestled at the foot of the Black Hills, on the western edge of Rapid City, SD, the Chapel in the Hills is a quiet retreat open to all visitors. As a special ministry of the South Dakota Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), the Chapel reaches out to vacationers and local residents alike, who look for a place to experience God's peace in their busy lives.

The Chapel in the Hills was built in 1969 and a dream come true for the preacher of the Lutheran Vespers radio hour, Dr. Harry Gregerson. The Chapel is an exact replica of the Borgund Stavkirke Church in Norway and over 25,000 visitors stop each year to see the church, museum, gift shop and the grounds.

The purpose of the church is to spread the gospel through sermons, music, weddings, vow renewals along with other special events. Worship services are held every Wednesday, Saturday, and Sunday evening at 7:30 pm during the summer months from Memorial Day through Labor Day. Each summer, local pastors and ELCA pastors from all around the country spend a few weeks serving as pastors-in-residence.

The Chapel also has an online store where wood carvings (crosses and nativity sets) as well as other items can be purchased. Sales of these items, rental fees for the events, and donations support this ministry.


