Dear Friends in Christ,

Last month I wrote the following words "As we move towards Lent, I find myself wondering about Wonder. We all have questions about God and life and suffering and blessing. We have questions about God's goodness and people's badness. Why did this (insert your experience here) happen to me? Why is this (insert) happening to me now?

What is going to happen in the future? Why does God seem so close and present and faith seem so easy sometimes while other times it is just difficult to connect to God?...This Lent, as we prepare to Celebrate Jesus' love for us on the cross and his resurrection from the dead, our invitation is to embrace Wonder."

As I am typing this letter, blizzard snow is swirling outside my window and Ash Wednesday worship is postponed until next year. I am going to miss communion and the somber ceremony of the ashen cross upon our foreheads. I am going to miss proclaiming and hearing for myself the words "From Dust you have Come and to Dust you Shall Return." I have always heard this as a simultaneous reminder of both death and life and that they are intimately

connected. One doesn't exist without the other. Death makes life meaningful, and being alive makes death a certainty. This is why Jesus had to come...so that we could embrace both life and death with hope and love and grace. We can let go of holding on to life, as hard as it is to let go. And we know it is hard, but holding on to life is equally as hard; the ashes remind us that we aren't in control; even Jesus, God's son, died. His cross is a reminder that we don't have to hold on---God has our lives already wrapped up in LOVE.

I am going to miss receiving the ashes on my forehead —but then I know it is just a ritual, completed once a year to remind me of the everyday state of my life: that I will experience suffering and pleasure; good and bad; events beyond my control; disappointment and

uncertainty and brokenness and joy and happiness and blessing. And that I will wonder about it all even as I am assured by the death and resurrection of Jesus that underneath the ashen cross on my forehead I am a beloved Child of God.

May you be Wonderfull of life as you live in the promise of the cross.



This college campus ministry serves at Black Hills State University and School of Mines and strives to build community, deepen faith, expand minds, and inspire service. They participate in Thanksgiving Basket deliveries, MLK Day of Service, stocking campus food shelves, crochet caps and scarves for the downtown statues, support the Pine Ridge Reconciliation Center, host retreats at Outlaw Ranch and other opportunities to do God's work.



Each week, they seek to feed their

members, both physically and spiritually and grow together in faith. They meet at both The Room in Spearfish and the Luther House in Rapid City for meals,

fellowship and project planning. They ask for ongoing prayers, especially each August when college classes start, safe travels on trips back to family and for those who will be moving on from college each semester.


