# A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR CHRIS BAESLER



Luke 24:30-35... "When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight. They said to each other, 'were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us? That same hour they got up and returned to Jerusalem; and they found the eleven and their companions gathered together. They were saying, 'the LORD has risen indeed and has appeared to Simon!" Then they told what had happened on the road, and how he had been made known to them in the breaking of the bread."

Dear Friends in Christ,

The story about the disciples and the resurrected Jesus on the Road to Emmaus comes to mind these days. This story reminds me that the LORD walks with us always, even as we move in new directions. What seems important to me is that the disciples are on the move, walking from a space of change, grief, and loss towards resurrection and new life, but they don't know it. We don't often know what the road ahead of us is going to bring other than that both challenges and blessings will come. We do know that the LORD is walking with us providing strength and sustaining us along the way. It is at the table, when Jesus blesses the food and feeds them that the disciples see this truth. We are walking on new, albeit separate roads, now and I trust that Jesus is walking with us, leading us towards new blessings. We are connected through the bread and wine, the body and blood of Christ, as our LORD invites us to come to the table and be strengthened for the journey ahead.

I am grateful for our relationship and ministry together. It has been an honor and privilege to be your pastor. Thank you to the staff and church leaders— your faithfulness hasn't gone unnoticed. I have been blessed by your commitment and passion. Thank you to church leadership, leading the congregation hasn't been easy as society and church communities have changed. Thank you for your dedication and willingness to serve and sacrifice in leadership roles. And to those of you volunteering time and talents, publicly or working behind the scenes serving mostly unnoticed. Thank you. Your dedication is an inspiration and blessing to God's work.






