A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR PAUL J. ERDAL, *Interim Pastor* "The Growing Season"

¹⁵ And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. ¹⁶ Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. ¹⁷ And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him. (Colossians 3:15-17)

This is one of my favorite Scripture passages ... "... Let the word of Christ dwell

in you richly …" Just about every word in this passage from Colossians is rich and nurturing for our faith.

The first Sunday after Pentecost marks the beginning of our "Growing Season" in the church calendar year. The color for this season is green, to indicate our growth in faith as we follow the teachings and ministry of Christ. Some assemblies use different shades of green throughout the Sundays after Pentecost, a lighter green in summer and a darker green in fall.

This growing season is also part of our spring and summer. Colorful flowers, perennials, annuals, shrubs, trees, vegetables and fruits all thrive in this season of growing. With plenty of sunshine, moisture, and fertilizer we pray for a bountiful harvest. When I was serving in the rural small communities of Minnesota where there were beautiful rows of beans, corn, sugar beets, etc., we counted on good rain at appropriate times ... at least once a week.

In these beautiful spring and summer months, may you consider the "growing season" and the words from Colossians 3:15-17 ... Remain Thankful to God

Let the word of Christ dwell within you

Sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God

And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him

CHAPEL IN THE HILLS

Nestled at the foot of the Black Hills, on the western edge of Rapid City, SD, the Chapel in the Hills is a quiet retreat open to all visitors. As a special ministry of the South Dakota Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), the Chapel reaches out to vacationers and local residents alike, who look for a place to experience God's peace in their busy lives.

The Chapel in the Hills was built in 1969 and a dream come true for the preacher of the Lutheran Vespers radio hour, Dr. Harry Gregerson. The Chapel is an exact replica of the Borgund Stavkirke Church in Norway and over 25,000 visitors stop each year to see the church, museum, gift shop, and the grounds.



The purpose of the church is to spread the gospel through sermons, music, weddings, and vow renewals along with other special events. Thirty-minute worship services are held on Wednesday, Saturday, and Sunday evenings at 7:30 PM in June, July, and August. Each summer, local pastors and ELCA pastors from all around the country spend a few weeks serving as pastors-in-residence.

The Chapel also has an online store where Jon Crane Watercolor Chapel prints, hardanger items, wood carvings (Nordic Gnomes, crosses, and nativity sets) as well as other items can be purchased. Sales of these items, rental fees for the events, and donations support this ministry.

This year, the Chapel has been chosen as the recipient of the Huether & Associates Thrivent Matching Grant Program. For every \$2 donated to the Chapel through this online campaign, Thrivent will match \$1, up to an total match of \$3,000. What brought you to SCLC? We moved to Rapid City 8 years ago and began looking at different churches in the area. What excites you about the church and all the changes moving forward? Watching us get back to pre-pandemic activities. It is like watching a flower unfold in all its splendor and beauty.

Tell us about your family. Tim and I met in band at Peoria High School in Peoria, IL. We will celebrate 37 years of marriage this summer. Tim works at Black Hills Energy in Human Resources.

What are some of your hobbies and interests? I have the privilege and honor of serving as the Artistic Director and Conductor of the Dakota Choral Union. Next fall will begin my 3rd season. Working with this group is another great JOY in my life. I also make hardanger embroidered ornaments to sell at the Chapel in the Hills.

What do you enjoy most about living in the Black Hills? Tim and I have lived in IL – a lot of corn; OH – quite beautiful; IA – a lot of corn; TX – hot, humid and no seasons; and CA – the desert part. We love the hills and the seasons; we've even become accustomed to hail. We are big National Park fans (we've visited 37 of them so far), so it's a joy to live in an area that holds so much beauty.


