

Faith Resolutions for 2025?

Yep, I said it. A new year is upon us. A time for new beginnings. A time to acknowledge the past while looking ahead to new possibilities, new dreams and new adventures. A time to make resolutions as we ponder what we want to leave behind, what we want to stay the same and what we want to change. Do your resolutions contain any ways to live out or deepen your faith?

On December 18, 21 & 22, I was formally installed as your senior pastor. Installation, for me, is a reminder of what I have been called to do and be as a pastor in your congregation. In the presence of those present, I promised to:



*Preach and teach in accordance with the holy scriptures and with the confessions of the Lutheran church.

*Carry out this ministry in harmony with the constitutions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

*Give faithful witness in the world, that God's love may be known in all that I do.

In doing these things, I not only fulfill my call as your pastor but I deepen my own faith and my relationship with God as well. As I have been pondering these promises, I acknowledged there are areas in which I need to improve. Those areas have become my faith resolutions for the new year.

But I was not the only one making promises at those worship services. You, the people of SCLC, made promises as well. These were the questions asked of you:

*People of God, will you receive Pastor Deb as a messenger of Jesus Christ sent to serve all people with the gospel of hope and salvation?

*Will you regard Pastor Deb as a servant of Christ and a steward of the mysteries of God?

*Will you pray for Pastor Deb?

*Will you help and honor Pastor Deb in carrying out this ministry?

*In all things, will you strive to live together in the peace and unity of Christ?

You, who were gathered, responded: We will, and we ask God to help us.

These promises are a reminder for me that I am not alone in this ministry. This is your congregation and you have been given gifts and talents to carry out the ministry to which we have been called. As we work together our faith will deepen and relationships will be built.

As you make your resolutions for 2025, I challenge you to take a look at your own faith and the promises you made during my installation. Are there faith resolutions you can make to aid in your faith growth? Maybe become more engaged and involved in the ministry of your church? Maybe increase your offerings? Maybe spend more time in prayer each day or immersed in God's Word? The possibilities are endless. If you are looking for a way to be involved or a new resolution, don't hesitate to reach out to me. I would love to visit with you and see if we can come up with a way for you to connect with God, others or our mission in the world this year.



Ministry of the Month - January

ABBOTT HOUSE

Abbott House has been transforming the lives of South Dakota youth for over 80 years, helping individuals aged 7–21 overcome trauma, abuse, and behavioral challenges. Through residential treatment, therapeutic foster care, and independent living services, Abbott House empowers youth and their families with opportunities for a brighter future.

To meet the growing demand for therapeutic foster care in Western South Dakota, Abbott House expanded to Rapid City in 2015. Today, they operate four Bridges Therapeutic Foster Homes in Rapid City, along with four Larson Independent Living Apartments designed to support young adults transitioning to independence.

Childhood is a critical, formative time, yet many face abuse and neglect within their homes. These hardships often go unnoticed, affecting children in our neighborhoods, schools, and communities. For youth facing the unimaginable, they offer a safe haven while working with the South Dakota Department of Social Services, Department of Corrections, and other agencies to provide hope and healing.

Financial donations may be given directly on our website, offering envelopes or envelopes at the back of the sanctuary.

Items we are collecting to donate include: shampoo, deodorant, tissues, paper towels, feminine hygiene products, toilet paper.
