South Canyon Lutheran Church Semi-Annual Congregation Meeting November 17, 2024

Pastor Deb opened the meeting in prayer.

President Diane Tschetter welcomed the church members and called the meeting to order. She announced that she was adding discussion of the new Kitchen Coordinator to the agenda and asked if there were any other changes to the agenda. None appearing, Desyl Petersen moved, and Jim Haar seconded that the agenda be approved as amended. The motion passed unanimously.

Gladys Storm moved and Joyce Thiery seconded that the minutes of the May 19, 2024 Semi-Annual meeting be approved as presented in the printed Semi-Annual Report. The motion passed unanimously.

Leadership reports were presented by various council members. The reports are printed in the Semi-Annual Report.

*Diane Tschetter presented her Presidents Report. She offered special thanks to our staff mentioning Kristi, Ellen and Mona in particular. In addition, she thanked and introduced the Council, the Ministerial team, and the Call Committee.

*Bob Thompson presented the Property and Grounds Report. He thanked Joel Petersen and the committee members for their hard work in keeping the church building in such good condition and invited others to join the team.

* Ken Bauman thanked Kristi Wellendorf and Andrea from Crow Peak Accounting for their efforts to reconstruct the Trust and Memorial Fund accounts. They researched gifts from the last 10 years to ensure they were all appropriately accounted for. Gladys Storm expressed concerns that the fund contributions totaling \$189,653.14 were not found in the Treasurers Report. Ken explained that many of the funds had been spent in accordance with the wishes of the gifter. Additionally, several non-interest-bearing accounts were consolidated into interest-bearing accounts.

* President Diane announced that the personnel committee has recommended to the Council that we offer the position of Kitchen Coordinator to a person who has been interviewed and seems very well qualified for the position.

*Byron Mutschelknaus presented the 2025 Budget (Mission Plan) along with comparisons from 2023 and 2024. Desyl Petersen moved and Byron seconded to accept the proposed budget to allow for discussion. Byron estimated that SCLC would have a surplus of approximately \$64,000 for 2024. He also announced that the presented budget amount of \$712,322 did not include a cost-of-living salary increase for all staff. If we approved a COL increase of 3% for all staff, the budget would increase to \$721,241. Dave Johnson moved that we approve the budget of \$721,241 which includes the COL increase. Steve Stensen seconded the motion. After much discussion, the amended motion was approved.

PJ Haar presented the Treasurer's Report. There were several questions regarding the budget and the deposit accounts. Gladys Storm requested that we determine how much Trust and Memorial funds were left and in which accounts we could find those funds.

Pastor Deb and Kristi discussed Thrivent Funds and how we could best utilize those funds. The church will provide training on how to access the funds. PJ asked for more volunteers to help with counting Mondays.

Unfinished Business:

Desyl Petersen discussed the work on the revision/rewrite of the Constitution and By-Laws. The work is basically done and will be presented to the council soon and then to the congregation for approval.

Diane announced that the Audit Committee and the Personnel Committee have been hard at work. The Audit Committee is reviewing procedures and processes. The Personnel Committee is developing job descriptions and meeting with staff.


No New Business was offered for discussion.

Music

Psalm 149 "Praise the Lord! Sing to the Lord a new song, his praise in the assembly of the faithful...let the children of Zion rejoice in their King. Let them praise his name with dancing, making melody to him with the tambourine and lyre."

We celebrated as we made joy-filled music to our Lord at South Canyon Lutheran Church this year! We continue to be blessed with dedicated and talented musicians of all ages that participated in -

- Sanctuary Choir, which practiced weekly throughout the program year and performed wonderful, meaningful cantatas during Advent and Holy Week,
- The Pop-Up Choir, who sang in worship once a month in the summer when the Sanctuary Choir was on break,
- Joyful Noise, which led the music in worship once a month during the program year,
- Bell Choir, a growing music ministry that rang once a month in worship, Sept April, and boasts 15 ringers. This number includes our substitutes. A 5th octave of bells is on our wish list and would help us continue to grow this ministry,
- Wednesday Worship Band, an 11-member, intergenerational band that provided music for the Wednesday worship services throughout the program year,
- Kid's Choir, which practiced each Friday afternoon during the school year. Each week they learned about the basics of music and developed their voices. We also played music games, practiced our pieces, shared a devotional, and ate treats in the Koinonia Kafe.

We are also blessed with talented pianists and organists: Marsha Mertes, Parker Knox, Justin Matters and Mary Weidenbach. Thank you to everyone who participated in the music program (and to the parents of our youngest musicians) for your dedication and support of these ministries! You make SCLC a music-filled house of worship.

As a continuing outreach to *Friend-Ship Preschool*, I offered a weekly *Music Time with Ms. Ellen* to the four-year-olds class. Every Monday, we sang fun faith songs with lots of motions, learned to play the colored tone bells, read bible stories, and always ended our time in prayer. At the preschool graduation celebration, we shared some of the songs we had learned throughout the year with the children's parents and grandparents.

Because of the SCLC 2020 Strategic Plan Goals regarding Community Engagement, the Dakota Choral Union continues to call SCLC "Home." Throughout the program year, DCU had over 80 members use the building on a weekly basis and their October and April concerts brought over 450 people into our sanctuary. In addition, DCU's annual Young Vocal Artist Competition was held at SCLC in March, bringing the students, their families and teachers to SCLC.

Also in March, we were blessed with an evening concert by the University of South Dakota Chamber Singers. I am very thankful to everyone who helped make their visit possible by cooking, serving and housing the 40-member choir. It was a spectacular concert that brought people from all over western South Dakota to hear this award-winning choir.

Worship

Our Worship Service Teams, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, continued to provide ushers, greeters and communion servers for Sunday worship throughout the year. This year we had two training sessions which allowed an open dialogue with all of the team members. The second session included a safety component by Officer, and church member, Eric Holmquist. I am grateful to everyone who participates on these teams, but especially to the team leaders for coordinating schedules. Mandy Mertes has replaced me as the contact staff person for the teams.

Many thanks to all of our members who served as assisting ministers, who worked the slides for worship and who streamed Sunday worship. Your services are a blessing to us all and are greatly appreciated! Mandy has taken on coordinating these services as well. At the beginning of the year, the Worship Committee presented to council a proposal for a new cross for the sanctuary. The chosen design was by Dennehey Design Co. out of Texas. The cross was approved and purchased with memorial funds, and was hung in the sanctuary on March 13 by members of the Property Team. Thank you to everyone who helped with this process. The cross is a beautiful addition to the sanctuary. Also new for Easter were the banners that hang on the east wall of the sanctuary.

Thank you to all the members of the Altar Care Team for continuing to provide services for communion and baptisms, for changing and caring for the paraments, for decorating the credence throughout the year and taking care of the chancel. Your time and commitment is greatly appreciated. A special thank you to Myra Duba and Robin Cox for their assistance in helping manage all of the altar care needs!

"Gizzy and Friends" continued providing a children's message (that is - children of all ages) in worship on both Wednesdays and Sundays. This year's scripts matched the lectionary and the Bible stories that the children learned in their education classes.

Finally, I'd like to thank the staff that prepares the bulletins, slides and announcements and generally help keep things running!

Children, Youth & Family

The past year at South Canyon Lutheran Church has been a busy time for CYF Ministries. We have been blessed to **SEE** God's glory, grace, mercy, and love through Spark Sunday School, Whirly Wednesdays, Middle School Faith Formation, 9th Grade Confirmation, and High School Youth Group.

Thanks to the Education Committee who helped <u>SEE</u> and <u>GROW</u> CYF Ministries here at SCLC, they have truly shown what it means to <u>SERVE</u>. The committee members are: Ann Hast, Chris Lehmann, Ed Dreyer, Eric Porisch, Halima Kringen, Heidi Tennyson, Lorie Whiting, and Nichole Morse.

At the beginning of the Church year, a CYF Ministries booklet detailing the education ministries, events, and activities for the year was mailed to congregation members. Monthly activities sheets were published in the newsletter and included in the welcome bags. Weekly emails were sent to all families informing them of the events and activities for that week along with any upcoming and special events.

With our **Pre-K through 5th graders** we saw their faith **GROW** weekly through lessons, videos, and activities that helped bring the stories of the Bible to life and helps the kids to understand the Bible a little better.

- Spark Sunday School was brought back this year after not having it for about 4 5 years. This is now weekly with many families coming to Worship again on Sundays and then their kids go to learn more about God and his son, Jesus.
- Whirly Wednesdays follow a similar format as Sunday but the lessons and activities are different. Both Spark Sunday School and Whirly Wednesday (Pre-K to 5th grade) are following the church year lectionary which furthers the growth of a child's faith as they are hearing the same message from weekly worship.
- **Highlights** for the group are: 3rd Grade Bible event, Halloween Trunk or Treat, Christmas Caroling, Christmas Program, Easter Egg Hunt, First Communion with Bread making and Painting of Chalices, and Students attending Friendship Preschool receive Jesus Time each week to learn about Jesus

Faith Formation for the Middle School has seen probably the most growth this past year. They participated in Love Thy Neighbor Community Care Projects throughout the year which included making tie fleece blankets and donating them to The Circle. Other projects were making Valentines and Crosses that were given to congregation members. Christmas ornaments were also made and handed out when we went Christmas Caroling.

• Other highlights for this group are: Completed Acolyte/Usher training to assist on Wednesdays, Campfire Conversations and Prayer Journals, game nights and other fun events, a dedicated space was created for them to hang out, and for the second year now, a group of kids went to Sioux Falls in February for Faith Fest at Augustana University

Confirmation is now being offered to the 9th Graders and happens during the school year from September to the end of April when Affirmation of Baptism is held.

• **Highlights** include: 19 individuals were confirmed in October of 2024, Confirmands had a Faith Mentor to assist them with their Confirmation journey, completed their Faith Statement Project, Program included: evenings to learn more about the Bible, the Creeds, Ten Commandments, and other Martin Luther teachings, other events and activities were Mentor evenings, tying of Quilts with the Piecemakers, a Mentor Celebration with the Faith Statement Projects, games with Youth Group, and other events to participate with the Youth Group

High School Group was very busy this last year as money needed to be raised for the Youth Gathering this past July in New Orleans. There were 25 individuals that flew down to attend the Gathering for a week. I expect it was an experience most will not forget. We learned what "Created to Be!" was all about. The kids worked hard doing many fundraising events and activities.

Highlights include: Assisted the Elementary group, decorated pumpkins to give to our congregation members and kids, helped with Halloween Trunk or Treat and went Christmas Caroling, Jesus Joy & Junk Conversations, Bible Study, and Campfire Conversations, Wednesday game nights and Lock-in, Game night with over 30 kids attending and 5th Quarter Party after the C/S basketball game, Bible Scavenger Hunt and Extreme Bowling, Ice Cream Social with 8th Grade to introduce each other, Palm Sunday Pancake Breakfast and the delicious Cinnamon/Caramel Roll Sunday, Opening of the Koinonia Coffee Bar at the end of April after school, Remodeling of Youth Room for a dedicated space with some new furniture donated by 5th & Main Furniture by Freed's, added a refrigerator for snacks, pillows were added, and was decorated.

Many other events and activities were held for all the age groups: Rally Sunday, Blessings of the BBB's, Baby Jesus Birthday Party, Easter Egg Hunt, Rush Hockey Faith Night, Campers attended Outlaw Ranch, VBS – Camp Firelight had over 70 individuals for 4 days in June, other Milestone celebrations, and a Mental Health Presentation was held for Parents, Congregation, and 6th-12th graders. Oh, we can't forget about our Dear wonderful Gizzy! All the laughs she gives us along with teaching us all about God with the many Bible stories. She is amazing for CYF Ministries, families, and congregation.

SERVE! When I see how CYF Ministries have grown this last year with all the families attending the events and activities - showing their support, **our serving hearts are seen**! Because we love God and do what He has asked us to do – love one another, CYF Ministries can continue to <u>SEE.GROW.SERVE!</u> We can continue to use our hands to do good, our feet to walk in His ways, our hearts to spread LOVE, and our mouths to speak words of kindness and spread His word to everyone! As we continue to grow CYF Ministries, many goals for next year have been discussed and one is to find additional volunteers for a more successful program and planning of adult education opportunities.



Rana Holland, Preschool Director

We have had a great year of learning and growth. We welcomed back four teachers: Julie Kokesh, Laura Mason, Dawn Dockter, as well as myself, Rana Holland. We have taught 30 children this school year across three different programs – Preschool 3s, a 3-day Pre-Kindergarten, and a 5-day Pre-Kindergarten.

Friend-Ship Preschool follows the South Dakota Early Childhood learning guidelines to help lay a foundation for learning/school readiness and a lifelong love of learning in our students. Our students enjoy a variety of opportunities including art, dramatic play, math, reading/writing readiness activities, music, PE, independent learning centers, and science activities.

Throughout the year we learn deeply about different topics. Some of the themed topics we have learned about this year are dinosaurs, bees, oceans, space, the pond habitat, our 5 senses, plants and seeds, and seasons.

Pre-Kindergarten is visited each week by Ms. Ellen who shares her musical talents with us. The students thoroughly enjoy singing Bible songs and learning the actions to these songs. We also learn how to play the bells with Ms. Ellen, which is a favorite!

Each class is also blessed each week by Jesus Time with Ms. Mona. Ms. Mona shares Bible stories, songs, and prayers with us. This is a weekly favorite for our students! Ms. Mona also teaches PE once a week with our Pre-Kindergarten students.

Additionally, we are able to share Jesus with these awesome little humans daily and during special times during the year. We read Bible stories, sing a daily prayer before snack, and focus on the true meaning of Christmas and Easter through stories, art, and hands-on activities.

It is our hope that all the students we teach feel loved, known, and excited to come to school each day to an inviting environment where they can reach their full potential.





The Outreach Committee has been revitalized. The following is the new job description put together by those serving on the committee.

The Outreach Committee is dedicated to expanding our congregation's vision for mission—locally, nationally, and globally. Our goal is to connect our faith community with opportunities to serve, support, and build relationships that reflect God's love in action. Through this work, the Outreach Committee seeks to equip and inspire our faith community to use their gifts, grow in faith, and serve to the glory of God.

To accomplish this, we will:

- Stay informed about the work of other organizations in our community and share this knowledge with the congregation.
- Identify and promote opportunities to support community needs, such as campus ministry, programs for children, feeding ministries, services for the aging population, and mental health awareness.
- Collaborate with other church members to educate the congregation about mission opportunities and encourage engagement.
- Facilitate ways for our church to support organizations through financial contributions, donations of needed items, and hands-on service projects.

We will continue to work with the Ministry of the Month recipients as well as find additional ways to serve. Our first new Outreach ministry is becoming the distribution site for Feeding SD Senior Boxes.

New Outreach Ministry – Feeding South Dakota

In April, we announced that we will be partnering with Feeding South Dakota in a new feeding ministry at our church. Feeding South Dakota (FSD) conducts a program to distribute food boxes on a monthly basis to around 300 low-income senior citizens in the Rapid City area. In the past, this distribution has been conducted at the FSD warehouse location in the northeast part of town. However, because these distributions pull resources away from their normal shipping/receiving/warehousing functions, they needed to find an offsite partner who was willing to take this on. We were made aware of this opportunity, and after initial feasibility discussions, our church council approved a pilot program that will run from June-August.

During the pilot program, we will have the opportunity to learn and adjust our processes as we complete our first few distributions. We will then report back to the church council with a recommendation on continuing the program. The coordinating team that is helping to launch this new ministry includes Diane Tschetter (who is also handing our volunteer recruiting), LaDonna Hamre, Janet and Joel Petersen, Jona Hagen, Dottie Olson, Ellen Shirley, Pastor Deb, and myself.

We have chosen to run the program on Saturday and Sunday during the second weekend of each month, conducting the distribution in 2-hour shifts from 9:00 am-3:00 pm on Saturday, and 1:00-3:00 pm on Sunday. The Saturday-Sunday distribution timeframe was chosen to provide the best possible times for food recipients or their proxies while hopefully providing the broadest possible pool of volunteers for the distributions.

The distribution will be a drive-through process in our parking lot for the recipients or their proxies. To manage this, we will be recruiting people for volunteer roles including traffic control, check-in, loading, and restocking.

We believe that this new ministry is a great fit for our church for a variety of reasons:

- It responds to the continued requests from the congregation over the past several years for more opportunities for hands-on mission work. Getting to do this from our own "front porch" as a church is an added benefit.
- It builds on our past and current hunger and feeding programs that have been a central part of our mission and outreach efforts.
- It helps the community get to know us and our church.
- It helps a key community partner because we're taking this on, Feeding South Dakota can divert resources to other food distributions they otherwise wouldn't be able to do.
- It engages us in the community, helping us to fulfill our Christian mission as a church.

We are very excited about this new ministry and hope that you can be part of it, either through volunteering, or with your support and prayers. You will be hearing more about this in the weeks to come, as we begin ramping up to serve those who are in need in our community.

Ministry of the Month:

In addition to the organizations our church has faithfully supported over the years, the Ministry of the Month team—working with the approval of Church Council—continues to broaden our congregation's awareness of the many ways we can serve others. By highlighting both longstanding partners and new opportunities, we seek to educate and inspire deeper engagement with a wider range of community needs.

Each month, guest speakers help us better understand the missions of local nonprofits and how we can come alongside them in support. These organizations serve critical and often underserved populations, including:

- Children and teens in foster care
- Seniors and the aging population
- Homeless veterans
- Individuals and families experiencing food insecurity
- Youth facing mental health challenges
- Expectant mothers and newborns needing prenatal care
- Women recovering from drug addiction, sex trafficking, and domestic violence

Through the generosity of our congregation—both in financial contributions and donations of much-needed items—we are blessed to make a tangible difference in the lives of those served by these ministries. Thank you for helping us extend Christ's love beyond our walls and into the heart of the community.

Free Lunch

Because we are located across the parking lots from Stevens High School, a former church staff member, Deanna Darr, wanted to find a way to reach out to high school students. Food was the logical choice. Did you know that was 22 years ago? The ministry of Free Lunch to high school students and staff continues to thrive in 2025. The ministry has grown exponentially since its early beginning, and the church has been supportive since its inception. The involvement and generosity of our congregation is amazing and appreciated.

We have established a great community relationship with our neighboring high school. They are so grateful for our kindness and generosity towards their students and staff, and know it's a safe place. They announce our monthly Free Lunch, and put the menus on the TV screens to help promote our event. We have been able to deliver a few pans of desserts to the staff most months, and they are delighted to receive them. I've been told that if I don't arrive shortly after the lunch has ended, the staff inquires if I've been there yet. High School staff rarely get treats I'm told!

In visiting with the school administration, we've learned that homeless students are part of their population, as well as families struggling with food insecurity. All students are welcome to participate in Free Lunch, so the playing field is level when they come for a free nutritious meal. Our congregation has also helped supply needed grocery items for the food pantries at both high schools and some elementary schools.

The gift of monthly Thrivent Action grants has been an important piece in helping to defray the cost of the meal. One such grant was used to buy ingredients for the Culinary Arts Class at Stevens. They were excited to be able to bake 400 desserts for us to serve at a recent Free Lunch. They don't have adequate funding to actually cook and bake. The Stevens high school youth representative to the school board spoke about this in her monthly report. A school board member confirmed that it was our church involved, and commented that this is an amazing ministry! Indeed it is! Another month, Culinary Arts students chopped and prepared all the veggies for our lunch, practicing their knife skills. They are excited to participate, contribute, and give back, according to their teacher, April Malik.

Volunteer hours are extremely important to The School of Mines Athletes. They look for opportunities to serve, give back, and find ways to connect in our local community. The Mines volleyball team has offered to help serve alongside our church members for a couple of Free Lunches this spring. They love interacting with the high school students, and our volunteers. What role models they are for all of us!

We have employed a new cook, Michelle Gab, who has offered enthusiastic support and delicious meals for this outreach ministry. No food is wasted, as the same menu is served the day after Free Lunch for our Wednesday evening meal at church. Leftover desserts sometimes supplement Wednesday night dinners as well. One month enough food was leftover to bless the Women and Children's shelter.

Our largest Free Lunch occurred last May during final exams when we served 415 students and staff. Unlike the normal lunch schedule of two 30 minute lunch periods, there is only one lunch scheduled during finals, but it lasts for an hour. It's quite an adrenaline rush to see them all arriving at the same time! Admittedly, this is an expensive, but important outreach. Lives are being touched in many ways in our community. If you've never had the opportunity to volunteer, please do. New volunteers seem to really enjoy the ministry, as the list of bakers, greeters, grillers, servers, and those that help with cleanup has grown to 154 people! You'll love the experience and the camaraderie as we welcome these young people into our Church building. **Diane Tschetter**

Associate Pastor Call Committee Update

As we've come to better understand the work in front of us under new leadership from Pastor Deb, the need for additional pastoral staff has become clear. So on January 19, 2025 ,the church council approved the hiring of an Associate Pastor for South Canyon, and shortly thereafter, formed a call committee to manage the search process.

The following individuals, who were also on the call committee for the Senior Pastor position, have graciously stepped forward to once again serve in the Associate Pastor call process: Jim Harr, Nichole Morse, Eric Porisch, Tim Shirley, Larry Thompson, and Joleen Wilson, along with Pastor Deb. This committee was introduced in the worship services on Saturday, March 8, and Wednesday, March 12, and was officially installed on Sunday, March 9.

The group then worked over the next couple of weeks to update the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) that we had used for the Senior Pastor call process and to tailor it for the Associate Pastor position. We then made the completed draft available to the congregation two weeks prior to the weekend of March 29-30, when Pastor Renee would be here to preach and conduct the ministry site study (a review and discussion of the MSP with the congregation).

Because threatening winter weather caused us to cancel that meeting, Pastor Renee instead conducted the ministry site study by Zoom with the church council, church staff, and the call committee on April 8. Based on this discussion, we made some additional updates to the MSP and submitted it on April 15. It was then formally approved on April 16 and placed into the synod's online search tool. As of this writing at the end of April, we are currently waiting for initial responses.

With our great pastoral leadership, staff, and congregation, we are fully confident that our church will be an attractive option for associate pastors seeking a new call, or for potential first call pastors. We appreciate your patience and ask for your prayers for our call process, as well as for the associate pastors who are discerning God's call to them. We will continue to update you on our progress as we move forward.
