Welcome Back! Welcome Back! Welcome Back!

(Yes, I have the theme song of Welcome Back, Kotter running through my head as I write this article.)
"I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord." Psalm 122:1

The season of 'welcome back' is upon us as summer gives way to fall. Welcome back to sports and marching band. Welcome back to school and sweatshirts. Welcome back to faith formation ministry and, for some, welcome back to worship after a busy summer of travel. We are excited to welcome everyone back and we are thankful for those whose smiling faces we have seen in worship throughout the summer. It is an exciting time to be a part of South Canyon Lutheran Church. The Holy Spirit continues to spread its dust inside and outside our church building among and through our community of faith.

The season of 'welcoming back' is a perfect time to stop and reflect on how we welcome others as well as how we practice welcoming hospitality all year long. We have wonderful greeters which is essential in fostering a welcoming congregation. Remember, though, one doesn't need to be a greeter to say "Hi, welcome to worship. We are so glad you are here." This can and should happen in the parking lot as well as anywhere in the church building. It can happen before, during, or after worship. I would feel horrible if someone came to worship and no one acknowledged their presence or said "Hi" the entire time they were here. It takes a whole congregation to make sure everyone is seen.

A Google search offered the following additional hospitality steps which we can take as a congregation.

- 1. Greet everyone you meet: Say hello to anyone within ten feet of you
- 2. Engage in conversation: Make newcomers (and others) feel welcome by asking thoughtful questions and actively listening to their stories.
- 3. Offer to help: Walk with new guests to their destination, like a classroom or the restroom, instead of just pointing them in the right direction.
- 4. Use the "Five-Minute" rule: Make an effort to connect with someone new in the minutes right before or right after the service
- 5. Make guests feel visible and valued: Go beyond a quick 'hi' to show you care by remembering names and continuing conversations beyond the service, if you can.
- 6. Pay attention to needs: Look for opportunities to serve others, whether it's offering to help someone with their children or providing a meal for a grieving family.
- 7. Use your gifts and resources: Use the time, money and talents God has given you to serve others and build His kingdom within the church.
- 8. Practice equity-based hospitality: Be sensitive to the diverse needs of people in your community, including those with food allergies, disabilities, and across different generations and cultures
- 9. Focus on relationships over perfection: Let go of the need to impress and prioritize cultivating community and genuine connection over creating a perfect atmosphere.
- 10. Pray for open eyes and hearts: Pray for discernment to understand the needs of others and to be a conduit of God's love and grace, mercy and forgiveness. (Source: AI Overview)

Feeding South Dakota Update (And Invitation!)

Thanks once again to our awesome volunteers for their work on the August 9-10 senior box distribution for Feeding South Dakota! Over that weekend, we distributed 161 boxes, up over 10% from last month, as recipients continue to find us at and make the transition to this new distribution site.

As we've completed these first couple of distributions, we've learned a lot about what works well and what we need to adjust. For example, on Saturday we've found that most of our recipients are coming during the earlier part of the day, so we're eliminating the afternoon (1-3 pm) shift that day. We've also learned more about the number and types of positions we need on distribution days, and have adjusted this accordingly.

If you haven't yet participated in one of our distributions, we hope you will consider participating in one of our upcoming events, which happen on the second weekend of each month. If you need help figuring out what volunteer role to sign up for, here's some information that might be helpful:

• For all roles, you will need to be able to stand (sometimes for extended periods) and approach individual cars. For safety reasons, we ask that all volunteers are at least 14 or in high school.

Least strenuous roles include:

- Traffic This person will be at the entrance to our lot, instructing cars on how to proceed through the parking lot to the check-in station.
- Ticket-Taker This person will wave cars into the loading area, take the tickets from the driver, ask driver where they want the boxes loaded in their vehicle, and let the loaders know how many boxes to load and where to load them.

Slightly more strenuous roles include:

• Check-In — Using our sign-in sheet on the clipboard, this person will find the recipient's name, check identification, get a signature, give the driver a ticket(s) corresponding to the number of boxes to be picked up, and direct the car to the loading area. This may sometimes require walking down a line of waiting cars and potentially working quickly during times of high traffic while maintaining accuracy.

More strenuous roles include:

- Loading This person will load a 30-35-lb food box and a 2-lb. cheese box into each vehicle.
- Restocking This person will frequently walk back and forth to the refrigerators (sometimes rapidly when traffic is high or product is needed quickly) and move boxes of cheese weighing 10-25 lbs. from the refrigerator to the loading area.

We hope you'll join us for an upcoming distribution in whichever of these roles is the best fit for you; you can sign up for upcoming distributions on the sign-up sheets in the Koinonia room, or reach out directly to Diane Tschetter at bdtschet@gmail.com. As those who have already volunteered can attest to, our recipients are very grateful for this important service that we are providing to them and to our community. We hope to see you there!


- Personal care & hygiene

The Grief Support Group will meet the first Thursday of the month at 6:30pm in the Mercy Room.




