

A Time to Mourn

When someone dies, many often wonder what to say to their loved ones. Our society is uncomfortable around death and dying, so we are often looking for something to say that will make us feel better when visiting with the family whose loved one died. When our Grief Group gathered in September, I asked them to name some unhelpful things they were told as well as helpful things that were said. I share our conversation with all of you to help you walk with those who are grieving.

Unhelpful Things to Say

Most of these are platitudes that minimize the loss and rush the grieving process. They are hurtful instead of helpful.

- *Are you [the caregiver] relieved they are gone?
- *It wasn't really unexpected was it?
- *Are you being punished by God?
- *God must have needed another angel.
- *I know how you feel.
- *You should be grateful for...
- *She's/he's in a better place.
- *Just give it time.
- *Everything happens for a reason.
- *You have to be strong.
- *At least they didn't suffer.
- *You shouldn't feel guilty....
- *It was God's plan and sometimes His plan doesn't make sense.
- *Your loved one would want you to be happy. (often people say that because they're uncomfortable with your sadness)

Helpful Things to Say/Do

- *I am so sorry.
- *There are no words. I am so sorry.
- *I will never begin to understand how you feel.
- *I miss _____ about [your loved one]. Never hesitate to share stories about the person who died, even days and months after their death.
- *I don't have the right words but I am here for you.
- *Offer specific help. Instead of "Let me know if you need anything," try "Can I bring you a meal on Thursday?" or "Would you like me to make some phone calls for you?" If you are not sure what to do but want to do something, speak with someone close to that person and ask for suggestions on what the person might need.
- *Be patient and offer continued support.
- *Validate their feelings. When Job's friends heard of Job's losses, the first thing they did was come and sit with him in silence. (Job 2:11-13) Ministry of presence is the best gift you can give to someone who has lost a loved one.

Thank you for being present with those who are grieving. Your gift of time means more than you will ever know.

Milestones Ministry – What is it?

<u>Milestones</u> are recognized Faith moments that foster growth in one's relationship with God, self, others, and all creation. This ministry gives the congregation the opportunity to recognize <u>Milestones</u> in the lives of our children each year. Freedom's Journey: Walking with Survivors from Slavery to Freedom

Freedom's Journey is a nonprofit ministry devoted to supporting survivors of sex and labor trafficking, offering a path from exploitation to healing and independence. Through strong relationships, trusted partnerships, and community education, Freedom's Journey not only aids survivors but also works to prevent human trafficking before it starts.

Mission & Purpose

At its core, Freedom's Journey is committed to helping survivors of all forms of human trafficking—both male and female—navigate the journey from slavery to freedom. This is accomplished through relationship and collaboration, while also combating trafficking through education, awareness, and advocacy at every level of society.

They actively work to prevent human trafficking by educating families, youth, educators, churches, civic organizations, healthcare professionals, and law enforcement. Their efforts help create a culture where victims feel safer coming forward and rebuilding their lives.

Support and Services for Survivors

Thanks to generous supporters, Freedom's Journey provides a comprehensive network of wraparound services, tailored to the unique needs of each survivor. These services may include:

- Case management and advocacy
- Safe shelter referrals and relocation support
- Lodging, meals, and safe transportation
- Assistance with immediate needs and personal items
- Mentorship and emotional support
- Help with recovering or replacing identification
- Legal aid and court accompaniment
- Job skills development and employment support
- Connections to healthcare and trauma-informed care
- Coordination with law enforcement when appropriate
- Ongoing resources for long-term healing

Survivors receive support from the moment they escape trafficking and for as long as needed on their path to recovery.






First Communion Class
